The narrator supports Margaret Thatcher's Tory government (1979-1990). To assess what this means, let's look at the key events of that

government.





- 1. 1981: IRA prisoners in Northern Ireland began a hunger strike demanding to be treated as political prisoners, not criminal prisoners. Thatcher refused, so 10 starved to death. Watch the trailer for *Hunger*, a film about the strike. We hear the voice of Thatcher at the start. What does she say? What else do we see or learn in the trailer?

- 3. 1984-5: Thatcher shuts down the coal mines, so miners go on strike.
- 4. 1990: Thatcher tries to bring in the poll tax, but millions refuse to pay.
